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


## ABSTRACT

This Kids Count data book is the eighth to examine trends in the well-being of Iowa's children. The report contains information on population trends by race and ethnicity and on family composition. This statistical portrait is based on trends over the past 20 years in 6 indicators of child well-being: (1) infant mortality; (2) low birthweight; (3) births to 16- to 17-year-olds; (4) teen unmarried birth rate; (5) child abuse and neglect; and (6) high school graduation rate. Part 1 of the data book presents a discussion of diversity, with a particular focus upon children and child well-being. This section notes that the growing diversity in Iowa's child population between 1990 and 2000 has major implications for public policy, especially for child and family issues; Iowa child and family policies will need to recognize and value the increasing diversity in its population while working to reduce racial and ethnic disparities in child outcomes. Part 2 of the report provides statewide Kids Count indicator data, including child deaths and teen violent deaths, by racial and ethnic groups, offering trend data over a 10-year period. This section also details indicators for rural counties, small urban counties, and metropolitan counties. Part 3, the bulk of the report, presents county data on the six indicators and provides information on trends from 1980 to 1999. The report concludes with acknowledgements and a contact for further information. (KB)

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# Foreword

**D**iversity and Opportunity: Children Leading the Way marks the eighth Iowa Kids Count data book. This year's report is the first to contain initially released data available from the 2000 census — on population trends by race and ethnicity and on family composition. Next year's data book will contain additional data from the 2000 census scheduled for later release.

This year's report also provides county-by-county data for a full twenty years on six key indicators of child well-being, along with county data from 1980 – 2000 on population and family characteristics. As in the past, there are statewide data in the same format and data aggregated by metropolitan, small urban, and rural counties.

The overview essay in *Diversity and Opportunity* is devoted to the issue of diversity, with a particular focus upon children and child well-being. One of the most significant changes in Iowa's population

between 1990 and 2000 is its overall racial and ethnic composition, and this change is most evident in the child population. Iowa's growing diversity has major implications to public policy, particularly on child and family issues.

In addition to the overview essay, the annual report also provides, for the first time, statewide Kids Count indicator data broken out by racial and ethnic groups, providing, where possible, the trend data over a ten year period. Because of the still relatively small size of the Hispanic and nonwhite populations, these data were not broken down to a county level.

Hopefully, this year's Kids Count data book will serve as a reference and resource for the next several years. While future data books will update all the data in this book, they will not provide twenty years of information on a county-by-county basis.

# **Part One**

## **Diversity and Child Well-Being: Opportunities and Challenges for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century**

**T**he United States, long regarded as a melting pot of different nationalities, races, and ethnicities, is becoming even more diverse in its make-up. National estimates are that, by 2020, the United States will have no "majority" group of children. Children of white, European descent will represent a minority of all children in the country. Hispanic children and children of color will constitute the actual "majority" of children.


### **Iowa Ethnic and Racial Trends**

Iowa's population similarly has been changing, with the 2000 census showing a very dramatic increase in the population of persons of Hispanic origin. Between 1990 and 2000, the white, non-Hispanic portion of Iowa's population declined from 95.9% of the total state population to 92.6% of the population. Most of Iowa's overall population growth during the decade is the result of increases in Hispanic and non-white residents, and children

have led the way in this respect.

As Table One shows, between 1970 and 2000, there has been a general overall increase in the proportion of Hispanic and non-white adults and children, with a particularly large increase between 1990 and 2000. The white, non-Hispanic adult population declined from 98.6% of the total adult population in 1970 to 93.9% in 2000. The shift was even more pronounced among children, going from 98.1% of the total child population in 1970 to 88.8% in 2000. Table One also shows the increases in the percentage of children of Hispanic origin and of African American (or black) race, the two largest population groups of children after white, non-Hispanic. Between 1990 and 2000, there was nearly a 155% increase in the number of Hispanic children in Iowa, the fastest growing child population group in the state. Children of Hispanic origin now are the second largest child population group in Iowa.

**Iowa Population Changes 1970–2000**




Note: The census changed its options for designating race in 2000 to allow people to choose two or more races, so figures are not strictly comparable between 2000 and previous years. The figures in 2000 for African American children include all children identified as African American, even if they also chose other race designations as well. Children identified both as African American and Hispanic are included in both the African American and the Hispanic counts.

For the first time in census history, individuals also were allowed to designate more than one racial group in 2000, in addition to designating whether or not they were of Hispanic origin. Therefore, an individual could claim to be both white and Native American, or even a combination of African American, Asian, Native American, and Hispanic. Bi- or multi-racial designations were created so that individuals could self-identify with more than one racial grouping, and this was particularly true for children. As Table Two shows, children were more than three times as likely as

adults to be designated as multi-racial, in many instances to reflect the racial backgrounds of both mother and father. Table Two also shows, for children, a more detailed breakdown of 2000 census data by race.

The numbers show clearly that the state's population, and the child population in particular, is becoming more diverse. Further, given that Iowa is still well below the national average in its diversity, any further population growth in Iowa is likely to be the result of increased diversity, particularly among children.

\*Multiracial refers to people who choose more than one race on the 2000 census.

This represents 15,920 children of two races and 1,042 children of three or more races. White and African American is the most common combination of two races (6,379), followed by White and Some Other Race (3,146), White and Asian (2,521), and White and American Indian and Alaska Native (2,462).

These numbers and trends have particular implications to the state's education system, which must respond to greater cultural and linguistic diversity and seek to model that diversity within its own workforce.

### County-by-County Comparisons



All counties in Iowa have experienced some growth in the diversity of their child population, but some counties have felt this impact much more than others. The two Iowa maps in Table Three show the relative concentration of Hispanic children and children of color in both 1990 and 2000. As the maps indicate, there is much more diversity in 2000 than in 1990, with the state's most urban counties having the highest diversity rates and many

now having more than 15% of their children either Hispanic or of color or both.

Several rural counties—Buena Vista, Crawford, Dallas, Emmet, Franklin, and Louisa — have experienced dramatic growths as well, most because of new employment operations that have recruited new immigrant populations, particularly Hispanics.

It still is in the most urban counties that the majority of children of Hispanic origin or of color reside, however. This is particularly true for African Americans, with 57.6% of all African American children residing in three counties — Black Hawk, Polk, and Scott — representing 10.3% of all children in those counties.

## Disparities in Child Outcomes


As this new diversity brings new opportunities, it also requires the state to examine how well children of different ethnicities and races fare. Examining the Kids Count

indicators of child well-being by race and ethnicity provides a very sobering picture.

While Iowa ranks very well among states in the 2001 national Kids Count report, 6<sup>th</sup> best among all

states and the District of Columbia, the picture looks quite different when these indicators are broken down racially and ethnically. Comparable national data broken out by race and ethnicity are available on Iowa Kids Count indicators for infant mortality, low birthweight, births to unmarried teens, and adolescent births. As Table Four shows, for three of these four indicators, African Americans and Hispanics fare worse in Iowa than they do in the United States as a whole.

Iowa's high national Kids Count ranking is the result of having a relatively small Hispanic or non-white population rather than doing better than other states in addressing issues of racial or ethnic disparity. In fact, the figures indicate that Iowa does less well than other states in terms of its child outcomes for children of color. Moreover, Iowa has not closed these gaps over the years or improved relative to the country as a whole on outcomes for African American children, in particular.

While it is not possible to draw direct comparisons with other states or the nation as a whole on other Kids Count indicators, racial and ethnic disparities also exist for child abuse and high school completion indicators. While Iowa does a much better job than the country as a whole in graduating students from high school, high school graduation

rates for Hispanic youth and youth of color remain much lower than for white, non-Hispanic youth, although some of this gap has diminished over time. Trend data, by race and ethnicity, are provided on the Iowa Kids Count indicators in the next section of this report.

### **Conclusions and Implications**

Fortunately, most children do well in Iowa. They are safe and healthy; and they grow up successfully in school and ready to enter the adult world as productive and responsible citizens. This holds for Hispanic, African American, Asian and Pacific Islander, Native American, and bi- and multi-racial children as well as for white, non-Hispanic children.

Still, the indicators presented here and elsewhere in this report clearly show that the risks and opportunities are not equal. As Iowa continues to become more diverse, children will lead the way, and child and family policies will need to recognize and value the diversity while working to reduce the disparities.

This is likely to be one of the greatest challenges, and opportunities, Iowa must face and successfully address if it is to continue to grow and prosper and its indicators of child well-being improve.
